DESCRIPTION OF THE PROJECT

The project will seek the visibility and elaboration of good practices of sustainable development from the disciplines of the students through the methodology of Participatory Action Research (PAR).

To this end, inter-university groups will be created around the challenge of sustainability and climate change. These international and interdisciplinary teams will reflect and work together on the problems of sustainability in their immediate reality, share good practices that exist in their local environment to address climate change and sustainable development and as a group will propose innovative solutions to a problem that they have identified as a group. The fact that the students are from the subject of Development and International Cooperation favours a long-term view and global thinking. The international character of the working groups will highlight the global nature of the sustainability challenge.
